At the meeting Throckley Residents' Action Group was set up, formed by volunteers, to take forward all views and concerns expressed. The Action Group met on 18 March and discussed not only the residents' opposition to the development proposals but also the inconsistent manner in which consultation has been conducted by Fairhurst. The Action Group will make all residents' views known to Fairhurst, Esh Group, English Heritage and Newcastle City Council's Planning Officer and again a further meeting will be requested with Fairhurst for clarity on the plans.

The Action Group have agreed to meet Tuesdays on a weekly basis. We will post updates and notifications of future meetings on notice boards in and around Throckley (Community Centre etc) and a website, for residents to access updates and express concerns, is under construction.

Next meeting of THROCKLEY RESIDENTS will be held Thursday 3 April at 6.00 pm in Throckley Community Centre.
